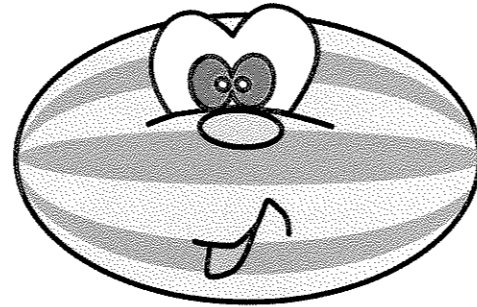


### June 17

- If you could visit the beach, would you rather collect seashells or build a sand castle? Why?

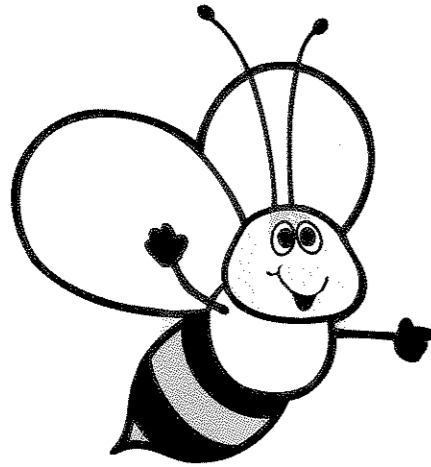


### June 21

- The sunlight lasts longer in the summer. Write about three things you can do because the days are longer.

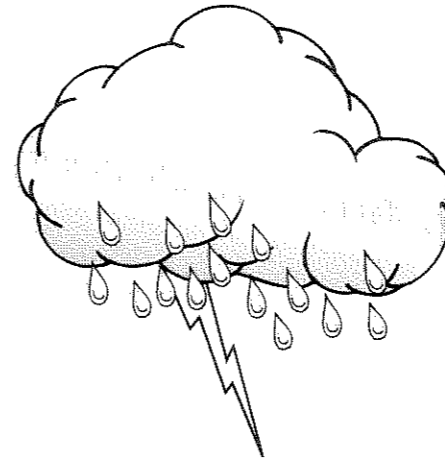

- Summer is the season for thunderstorms. What are three ways you can tell a thunderstorm is on its way?

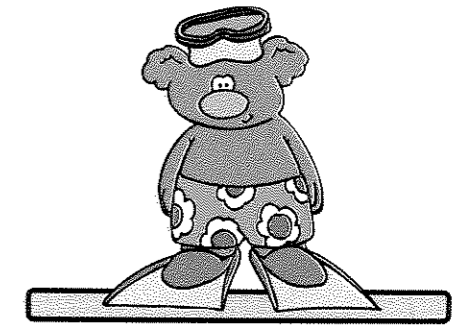
### June 19
